Q 29. Why is the Son of God called Jesus, that is,

A. Because He saves us from all our sins,[1] and
because salvation is not to be sought or found in
anyone else.[2]

A. No. Though they boast of Him in words, they in
fact deny the only Saviour Jesus.[1] For one of two
things must be true: either Jesus is not a complete
Saviour, or those who by true faith accept this Saviour
must find in Him all that is necessary for their
salvation.[2]
